



Cross-border integrated strategy to reduce BIODiversity loss due to anthropogenic PRESSures Along ADRIatic Coast

DESCRIPTION

BIOPRESSADRIA will develop a cross-border strategy to mitigate the negative impact of nautical and beach tourism on marine and coastal biodiversity, with innovative solutions applied to coastal management. The assessment of marine and coastal habitats degradation and the analysis of tourism pressures will be conducted in 5 pilot areas in Italy and Croatia. A constructive dialogue with stakeholders will contribute to a systematic review of tourism pressures, with the development of specific measures for their mitigation. During the project, trainings will be given to stakeholders to increase their capacity building in coastal management and conservation.
